Child Questionnaire

1-What doe safe mean?

2- Do you feel safe in school?

3- Do you have the right to be safe?

56 children took part out of 88 on school roll due to absence (64% of all children).

Children who took part:

Question 1- 72% of children were able to talk about being safe

Question 2- 79% of children felt safe at school, out of 56 children 12 have high level SEND (21%). For these children, their families were asked if they thought their children felt safe at school.

Question 3- 79% of children were able to say they have the right to be safe.

‘Helmet on my bike’

‘Hat in the sun, no burn’

‘We tell the teachers’

'Naz says, stop it's too high in case we hurt we hurt our legs'
